



LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENTS Janet & Irwin Tobin

After 10 months of not being able to travel to Israel, we finally landed on Yom Ha'atzmaut (April 14th). We were greeted by our children and grandchildren. It was a very thrilling welcome as we had just become dual citizens.

Along with our return we were finally able to visit the staff and children at Neve Hanna. Antje Naujoks, PR Director, quickly made arrangements for our visit and meeting with the staff. It was so exciting and we received such a warm welcome from everyone. We had not been able to visit for 18 months due to Covid.

We toured Neve Hanna and saw all that the staff and volunteers did to liven the surroundings. Everything looked beautiful. New murals were painted on the exterior of the buildings and all the outdoor equipment was freshly painted. The totally renovated bakery is sleek and modern. We made sure to buy bread, cookies, crackers and big pretzels for our whole family to enjoy.

Next, we viewed the beautiful new library. Thanks to all of you that contributed to this wonderful project. We are hopeful that you will continue to help us enlarge and maintain it. In July, a professional librarian was hired to begin working to set up the library. Itzik Bohadana, our Director, would like to have the library dedication in late August, before the opening of school and before we leave Israel.

This year, for security concerns, the

B'nai Mitzvah location had to be changed from Robinson's Arch, the egalitarian section of the Wall, to the Leonardo Hotel in East Jerusalem. Due to the passing of Rabba Liron Levy Rosensaft's father, the B'nai Mitzvah was postponed until June 17th, two and a half weeks later than planned. With Rabba Liron's direction the children were able to learn their new Torah passages.

The service was held in the hotel synagogue. Each child was led up to the Bima, for their aliyahs, by parents or two members of their family. The children were unbelievably fantastic reciting their new Torah passages. They were so remarkable and so proud of themselves and so happy. They looked up to Rabba Liron with much love and such a feeling of accomplishment. The service was filled with tears and admiration and loud applause from all who attended. The celebration continued in the hotel social hall with a complete program and luncheon.

VISIT TO THE DIALOGUE IN THE DARK MUSEUM Rabba Liron Levy Rosensaft

"Do not curse the deaf or put
a stumbling block in front
of the blind, but fear your
God. I am the Lord"
(Leviticus 19:14)

Every year one of the B'nai Mitzvot highlights is our visit to the Dialogue in the Dark museum. In this extraordinary exhibit, we can't see anything, but we discover a whole world and maybe, especially, ourselves.

During the tour, blind guides lead the children through dark designed spaces: nature, a noisy pedestrian crossing, a port, a market, and a pub. Blind and vision-impaired individuals take an active part in opening the visitor's eyes in the darkness, demonstrating that their world is not poorer, but simply different.



We are hoping the exhibit will lead the children to have a unique experience and

to introduce them to the rich sensory world hidden within each and every person, and to create an unbiased encounter between blind and sighted people.

We truly and honestly believe that the exhibit can cause a true change in the way our teenagers perceive others, and those who are different.

TORAH WORKSHOPS

Since Shavuot I have been thinking about the experience I had at Neve Hanna when I did workshops for over 50 children. In Israel, for more than 15 years, I have been teaching preparation courses for bar/bat mitzvah children in a variety of classes, workshops and lectures. I am familiar with what questions children can most often answer and what questions they find difficult. A simple example — not everyone in grades 6-7 preparing for a bar/bat mitzvah knows how to answer the question: “What is the first mitzvah in the Torah.” Usually, only students in very religious schools know this answer.

In Neve Hanna there was no problem with this question. It was a most welcomed surprise to hear the answer. I give the credit to Rabba Liron’s marvelous teaching of the children.



During my workshops, I try not to lecture. I hold conversations creating interaction with the children. I ask questions and listen to what they have to say. I was happily surprised to discover that the Jewish knowledge at NH was superior

to other schools where I teach both Judaism and general courses.

I feel I am privileged to be a Shaliach Mitzva and write a Torah scroll for the children at Neve Hanna. A Scroll that will bring additional learning and excitement to the children.

NEVE HANNA children embrace our Jewish heritage through a commitment to study, ma’asim tovim and mitzvot.

The children are very excited to be learning with the Scribe Rabbi Hannah Klebansky and Rabba Liron Levy Rosensaft. Our children will proudly be able to study, read from and carry their own Sephardic Sefer Torah.

In addition to our friends who have participated and contributed to the **TORAH PROJECT**, the children at **NEVE HANNA** will each contribute a letter to be inscribed in the last book of the Torah. What a source

of pride. They — and we — are justifiably proud of their accomplishments.

In honor of our Bar and Bat Mitzvah children, we encourage you to add your name to the Torah Dedication! Choose words, or sentences, or whole chapters to be inscribed in the Torah scroll. This is an especially meaningful way to commemorate a special occasion, such as a birth or a Bar/Bat Mitzvah, or to memorialize a loved one.

We will launch the Rabbinic Circle with a “virtual tour” and staff “meet and greet” to be held over zoom after the fall holidays.

It is my pleasure to organize this effort. I had the privilege of serving as the volunteer student rabbi at Neve Hanna during my rabbinical school year in Israel more than 40 years ago. Neve Hanna has grown so much since then with so many exciting programs and endeavors. But, even then, in a much earlier day, it was evident as to how unique a community it is. Today,

through the work of staff and volunteers, Neve Hanna is a thriving, exciting place educating and supporting the children in so many critical ways.

THE PATH TO PEACE PROGRAM

Thirty years ago, Dudu Weger, President of NEVE HANNA met with the Director of the School of Peace in Rahat.

They immediately decided to set up joint groups, one from Rahat and one from NEVE HANNA, gathering together every two weeks, interchanging between both communities. In September 2004, **Path to Peace**, the Jewish-Muslim Day Care Center was established and opened at NH for Jewish and Arab youth from both Kiryat Gat and Rahat. **Path to Peace** is the first co-existence project for children of marginal backgrounds. Both Hebrew and Arabic are spoken. The children are cared for by Jewish and Muslim educators.

Youth meetings take place at the joint Jewish-Muslim-Christian theater group and **Path to Peace**, an interfaith daycare center for Jewish and Muslim-Bedouin children at NH.

The Daycare Center for Jewish and Bedouin children offers educational activities and also aims to assist families in economic, social and emotional distress. This venture, based on cooperation with our Bedouin partners from the city of Rahat, aims to empower these underprivileged children with equal opportunity and promoting understanding.

We aim to teach tolerance through education. These children are often treated with prejudice and suspicion and generally

experience difficulties integrating socially. The cooperation of the families is an essential factor in the success. Parents enroll their children in the daycare program as an active step toward a foreseeable change. They take part in a program designed especially for them, including joint parent-child-activities.

Therapeutic treatment and scholastic assistance are offered to children with behavioral and social problems whose families struggle also with a variety of different hardships.

The Jewish and Bedouin participants form bonds based on mutual respect, friendship and acknowledgment of the other. It is thus that the two groups are brought closer to fight bias, establishing a liberal worldview based on values of international understanding, tolerance and pluralism among children as well as adults.

NEVE HANNA was honored with the prestigious **Golden Dove of Peace** award for 2015-2016 in recognition of its outstanding work in educating children in accordance with the principles of fellow man as well as its special achievements



within the field of International Understanding between Jews, Muslims and Christians. The Golden Dove of Peace has become a world recognized award symbolizing peace, to be passed around the world from person to person, from institute to institute. Past recipients of the Golden Dove of Peace include: Amnesty International, Green Peace, Nelson Mandela, Mikhail Gorbachev, Pope Benedict XVI., US-President Barack Obama, the Dalai Lama and German Chancellor Angela Merkel. 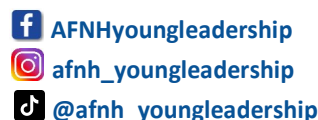
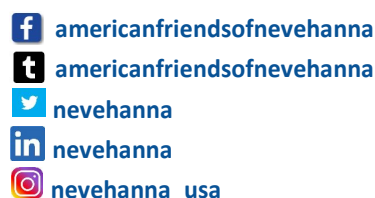
